



How can my jurisdiction participate in SaskAlert?

Participation in SaskAlert is voluntary. Local governing jurisdictions are not mandated to participate in the SaskAlert program; it is the decision of the jurisdiction's elected officials if they are going to participate.

If your jurisdiction is interested in participating in the SaskAlert program, here is information on getting started:

- Participation in the SaskAlert program is currently at no cost to the jurisdiction.
- Jurisdictions have their own trained people who can access the national alerting system and issue an emergency public alert quickly in order to notify their residents or visitors.
- Jurisdictions wishing to participate must complete a Jurisdiction Designation Form and return the form to either the email address or mailing address listed on the



form. The trainees listed on the form will then be put onto the training list and will receive notification through email when training sessions are taking place.

- Trainees must attend a four-hour training session on the SaskAlert policy and procedures and on how to use the national alerting system. There is no cost to register and take the SaskAlert training session, and sessions are held at various locations across the province.
- Jurisdictions can sign up to participate on their own or can join with a neighboring jurisdiction(s) and form a larger organization.
- Jurisdictions will not be required to purchase any specialized equipment or computer software. All that a jurisdiction needs is a computer, internet access and users who are comfortable navigating on a computer.
